General Meeting Minutes – October 14, 2025

Opening: Cheryl Moran

- 1. Meeting was called to order at 6:31 pm
 - a. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by President Cheryl Moran
 - b. Twenty new members were recognized
- 2. Participants
 - a. 106 attendees were present

Secretary Report:

- 1. Previous general meeting minutes from May were posted to the website
 - a. No updates were received
 - b. Motion to approve minutes by Rita Girou with 2nd by Beth Bowen passed unanimously.

Treasurer Report:

- 1. Budget and Treasury balance discussion
 - a. Current financial report was reviewed
 - b. 2025 member count stands at 410
 - c. Annual federal taxes will be filed by October 31
 - d. Audit will be scheduled for Q4
 - e. Motion to approve report by Per Oleson with 2nd by Mary DeFranco passed unanimously.

President Report:

- 1. Eastport- Central Lake
 - a. Trial run by the captains and officers was completed on October 9th
 - b. Beth Bowen spoke to the beauty of the area, the convenience of the building and thanked the committee
 - c. Pan Am confirmed that space is available for a 4-lane 1,000 meter race
- 2. PanAm completed the required annual boat inspection for the club for free, a \$500-\$1500 value
- 3. PanAm also built and delivered three nose guards for boat storage in 3 days, also for free
 - a. The club will extend a gratuity to Pan Am for their assistance and support
- 4. Official Central Lake opening iis tentatively set for January 2026
- 5. Lake permits are up to date for 2026
- 6. Memorandum of Understanding
 - a. All requirements have been met for 2025-2026 Fiscal Year

Vice President Report:

- 1) Annual Safety Review
 - a) The Number 1 priority on the boat is safety
 - b) Highlight of some general safety rules;

- i) PFD fanny packs are to be worn in front of the body, never in back
- ii) The Steerperson is the person in charge of the boat
- iii) Inclement weather rules require that boats are NOT on the water in these conditions;
 - (1) Fog Miona, cannot see across the lake; Sumter, cannot see the lighthouse
 - (2) Whitecaps do not go out if present and return to shore when they begin
 - (3) Thunder return to shore and wait a minimum of 30 minutes from last bolt
- iv) Wear comfortable clothing, a wearable ID and bring water on the boat
- v) Use a locking forearm grasp to enter and exit the boat
- vi) Pass equipment to a teammate when entering and exiting the boat; do not put equipment on the dock
- vii) Review the web site safety rules; all 4 pages!

- 3) Sheriff's Office Presentation
 - a) Sgt. Adam Dodge reviewed many FREE programs provided by the Sherriff's Department available by contacting the Sherriff's Office
 - i) Vial of Life (need to know info for first responders; keep updated, place in fridge door)
 - ii) Peace of Mind (daily call-in)
 - iii) Home Security Inspections (security/safety review)
 - iv) Alzheimer/dementia DREAM program (GPS enabled location monitor)
 - v) Human Scent Preservation kit (used to locate missing persons)
 - b) Golf Cart Safety
 - i) DUIs occur more often in golf carts than cars
 - ii) use seat belts and car seats for kids
 - iii) speeding over 20 MPH in a golf cart is a misdemeanor with a required court appearance
 - c) Sherriff's Department mobile app
 - i) Provides information regarding community crime, most-wanted, inmate lookup, sex offenders, scams, etc.
 - d) Alert Sumter for local severe weather notifications
 - i) Set up alerts for only weather issues that will affect you
 - e) Scams
 - i) Sumter Scam Sting on mobile app (share experiences)
 - ii) Seniors vs. Crime will help with civil issues; also acts similarly to BBB with referrals
 - f) Be aware of crimes of opportunity (unattended items, etc.)
 - g) Make small smart decisions; i.e., 9 PM routine close and lock doors (cars, garage, etc.)
